









CEDAR RIDGE PRESERVE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- There are venomous snakes in the preserve. They are protected by state law—leave them alone.
- There are harmful plants in the Preserve. Know what poison ivy looks like and avoid it.
- Do not attempt to touch, befriend, feed, or help any wild animal you encounter in the Preserve.
- Alcohol and other intoxicants are strictly forbidden.
- All motorized vehicles of any kind or size are strictly forbidden beyond the parking lot.
- No fireworks, firearms, or any other weapons allowed. (Enforced by Sheriff's Department and local authorities.)
- No hunting, fires or overnight camping.
- No bicycles allowed on trails.
- No specimen collecting of any kind allowed without permit.

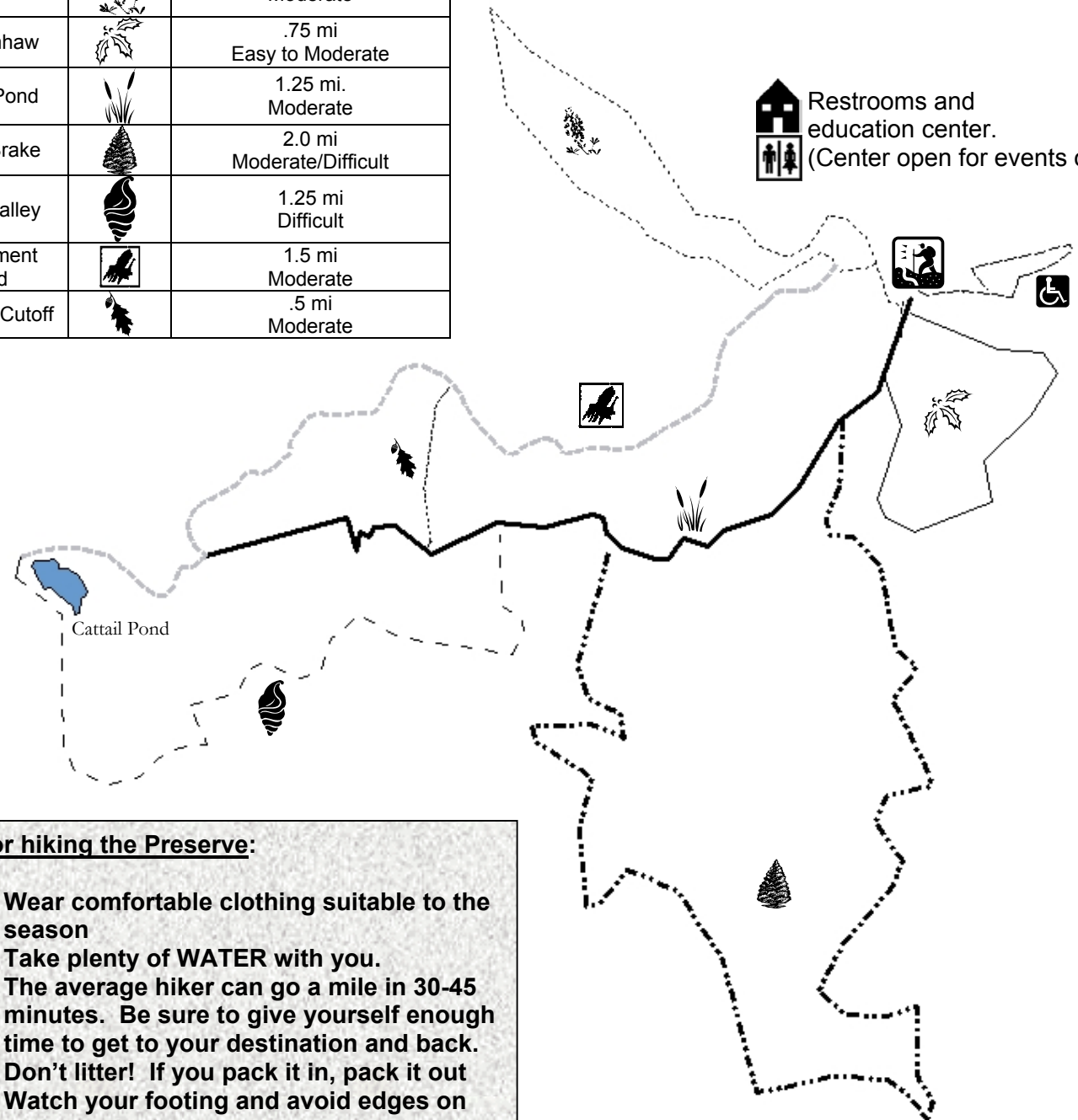

Tips for hiking the Preserve:

- ❖ Don't litter! If you pack it in, pack it out
- ❖ Watch your footing and avoid edges on path overlooks.
